Richmond University students enrolled in the Italian Literature course will hold a ‘literary’ meeting, consisting in a short introductory lecture on the role of women in Dante’s work *The Vita Nuova*, followed by a guided tour .

After explaining and interpreting Dante’s key words, making them more accessible to the contemporary ear, our very special guides will lead participants to view some of the Dante’s Plaques – inscriptions placed in streets and squares by the city of Florence in 1900 - referring to those Medieval places that



played a particular role in shaping the relationship between the Author and his ‘female creatures’.
